Agnew, Frank H.

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1884

Frank H. Agnew's imprint was found on a photograph in the Institute for Regional Studies collection (51.60.1). He is also listed in the city directory in 1884 as living at 618 1st Avenue in Fargo.

Amundson, Alf

Business address: Unknown Business years: Circa 1905-1915

A small number of photographic postcards with Fargo scenes, privately held, list Alf Amundson as the photographer. No more information regarding Amundson could be found, assuming he lived and worked in Fargo. Likely photography was his avocation not his vocation.

Anderson, Charles W.

Business address: 230 Broadway Business years: 1918-1921

Charles W. Anderson was a photographer first in Grand Forks and Larimore, North Dakota in the 1912 business gazetteer for 1912. He then appears in the 1918 and 1921 business gazetteers for Fargo. In the Fargo city directories for the same time, Nicholas E. Pitsch is listed as a photographer at 230 Broadway going back to 1910. Possibly Mr. Anderson worked for or with Mr. Pitsch for a short time.

Anderson, David, 1883-1962?

Business address: 1340 12th Avenue North (1926?-1932); North Dakota Agricultural College (1934-1945) Business years: 1924-1945

David Anderson was born March 2, 1883 in Sillerud, Sweden and studied photography there and in Germany. In March 1903 he immigrated to the United States, apparently coming to the Red River Valley. He worked as a photographer in Hawley, Minnesota before moving to North Dakota. Before 1909 he practiced photography in Cooperstown. He was in Aneta from December 1909 until June of 1910, when he sold his studio to Nils P. Hamre of Fargo. He moved to Hillsboro, and then to Mayville in 1912. Prior to 1912 he married Helen (last name unknown) from Cando, North Dakota. Helen was born circa 1890 in North Dakota and they had daughter Ruth, born circa 1914. Mr. Anderson had his studio in Mayville until the early 1920s. By 1924 he was living in Fargo and had opened a studio in his home at 1340 12th Avenue North, across the street from the North Dakota Agricultural College. By 1934 he began to operate his studio at the North Dakota Agricultural College in Morrill Hall. The college granted him office space in exchange for his photographic work. After 1930, he is listed in the city directory along with his wife Inga. Mr. Anderson was a member of the Professional Photographers of America, serving on its council. He also had won a number of medals for excellence in photography. Sometime after 1945 David Anderson moved from Fargo and left his negative and prints collection with the Fargo Chamber of Commerce. In 1951 the collection was donated to the Institute for Regional Studies. Nothing more is known about the family after leaving Fargo. This David Anderson may be the same David Anderson who died in December 1962 in Maryland, having the same date of birth.

Baldwin, Ernest E. and Raphael E.

Business address: N.P. Block (1924-1927); 2 1/2 Broadway (1928)

Business years: Circa 1924-1928

Ernest Baldwin is found as a Fargo photographer only in the city directories from 1924 to 1928. In the 1928 directory his wife Violet is also listed. Raphael Baldwin is listed only in the 1924 directory.

Barnes, Wallace D.

Business address: 224 N.P. Avenue Business years: 1899 (as Olson & Barnes)

Wallace D. Barnes appears only in the 1899-1900 Fargo city directory in partnership with A.C. Olson. At that time he was boarding at the Elliott Hotel, but by 1900 he was no longer living in North Dakota. Nothing more has been found regarding Mr. Barnes.

Becko, Harold See Harold's Studio

Bell, Clark

Business address: 509 N.P. Avenue

Business years: 1912 (Reed Bell Company)

Clark Bell is listed in the 1912 business gazetteer as the secretary of the Reed Bell Company (See Charles E. Reed).

Bentley, Arthur A., 1870-

Business address: Smith Bock

Business years: 1895-1900 (as A.A. Bentley & Company)

Arthur A. Bentley was born in March 1870 in Minnesota. He came to Fargo and established his photography studio circa 1895. Circa 1896 he married Minnie (last name unknown), who was born in February 1873 in Minnesota. They had two children: Sarah, born March 1897, and Lizzie, born June 1899. His studio employed a large staff, and around 1898 he had studios for a short time in a number of North Dakota towns including Buffalo, Edgeley, LaMoure, and Lisbon. People working for Bentley included H.D. Corliss, Mrs. J. P. Lockwood, J.O. Redd, and H.M. Smith. In 1902 Mr. Bentley is listed as having a studio at Sheldon, N.D. Nothing more is known about Mr. Bentley.

Bestic, Arthur E., 1862-1924

Business address: 204 Broadway

Business years: 1885-1886 (as Bestic & Logan)

Arthur E. Bestic was born in Dublin, Ireland on August 24, 1862. He came to the United States in 1881 and moved directly to Fargo and began farming. He farmed for only eighteen months when he began to work for the *Evening Post* newspaper in Fargo. After only five months the newspaper went out of business, and Mr. Bestic took a position at the *Argus* where he worked for twenty years. Only in the 1885 city directory and an 1886 gazetteer is he listed as a photographer, in partnership with S.H. Logan in Bestic & Logan. In 1886 he married Minnie Oldham in Springfield, Ohio and they had a son named Arthur K. Bestic. Minnie died in 1889, and in 1902 Bestic married Anna Dolesky of Wahpeton, North Dakota. Together they had three sons. After retiring from the *Argus* he worked for Walker Brothers of Fargo as a salesman. Mr. Bestic died November 12, 1924 in Fargo.

Chial, Alfred, 1879-1953

Business address: 55 1/2 Broadway (1932-1936); 4 1/2 South Broadway (1936 as Chial Genelli Studio);

516 1st Avenue North (1938-1940)

Business years: 1932-1940

Alf (Alfred) Chial was born on January 20, 1879 in Vermland, Sweden. Sometime after arriving in the United States in 1896, he married Olga Bergman of Lake Park, Minnesota. Mr. Chial first worked as a photographer in Lake Park and is listed in the 1912 Polk Gazetteer. Between 1920 and 1930, Mr. Chial traveled around the world four times and took pictures in many countries. In 1923 he came to Fargo and became a travel agent. In 1930 he became a coal distributor, and by 1932 he had added a photography business. He continued his photography business until sometime after 1940. He was associated with Walter Schramm for a short time in 1936, known as the Chial Genelli Studio, located at 4 1/2 South Broadway. After his photography career he held various jobs. He died in Plentywood, Montana on August 11, 1953, and his wife Olga died on April 12, 1954.

Clow, Frank W., ca. 1857-

Business address: Jefferson corner of 12th Street

Business years: 1885

Frank W. or William F. Clow was born in Canada in May 1855. He immigrated to the United States in 1872 and moved to Fargo around 1881. He is listed as a salesman in the 1881 city directory, but he does not appear again until 1885 when his profession is given as a photographer in both the city directory and the census. He was single when living in Fargo but was married shortly thereafter to Sarah W. (last name unknown). Sarah was born in December 1861 in Canada. In about 1886, Mr. Clow moved to Lisbon, North Dakota where he operated a studio until 1900. He also operated a studio in Edgeley, N.D. in 1900. Likely the Vera V. Clow who died in Lisbon, N.D. on February 17, 1888 at the age of six months was their daughter. In the 1900 census his name is given as Franklin W. Apparently they left the state shortly thereafter.

Corliss, Harland D., 1871-

Business address: Smith Block

Business years: 1896-1899 (with A.A. Bentley & Company)

Harland D. Corliss was born in November 1871 in Pennsylvania, his parents having come from Vermont. He came to Fargo circa 1896 and was employed at A.A. Bentley & Company, both at its Fargo and Lisbon, North Dakota photograph studios. Circa 1898 he married Clara R. (last name unknown), and by 1900 Mr. Corliss had moved to Casselton, N.D. and opened his own studio. He remained in Casselton after 1904 when he left the photography business and apparently returned to Fargo. In 1907 he was in business with T.E. Wall as Corliss & Wall, confectioners and ice cream manufacturers. The business apparently ended soon and Mr. Corliss is listed as being in real estate until 1911. Nothing more is known about Mr. Corliss.

Criley, Ira H., 1872-

Business address: Unknown

Business years: 1900

Ira H. Criley is found only in the 1900 Fargo census where he gives his profession as a photographer. He was born in April, 1872 in Pennsylvania. At the time of the census he was residing at 307 1st Avenue North with two other men listed as photographers, G.W. Stigleman and Al Smith.

Darcy, William J.

Business address: 518 Front Street (Main Ave.)

Business years: 1924

William J. Darcy began his photographic career in this area in Moorhead, Minnesota in about 1919 when he appears in the city directory. His studio was located at 114 1st Avenue. Apparently after 1920 he moved his studio to 518 Front Street in Fargo where he is found listed in the 1924 Fargo city directory. He apparently left the state shortly thereafter.

Davis, Harlan W.

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1916

Harlan W. Davis is listed as a Fargo photographer in a 1916 gazetteer. He is not found in any city directory and therefore was in Fargo for a very short time.

Dennis, William C.

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1922

William C. Dennis's imprint was found on a photo in the Institute for Regional Studies collection (2063.29.29). In the 1922 city directory, a William C. Dennis was living in Moorhead, Minnesota at 1110 7th Avenue North. In the 1919 city directory he is listed as working as a teacher at Moorhead High School. After 1922 he is no longer listed.

Dewey Studio

Business address: Edwards Block (1908-1919); 317 Broadway (1919-1924); 216 1/2 Broadway (1924-1936); 22 Huntington Block (1936-1940); 104 12 Broadway (1940-1945) Business years: 1908-1945

Archie L. Dewey was born on November 17, 1887 in Jamestown, North Dakota. After his graduation from high school, Mr. Dewey was employed with Northwestern Bell Telephone Company. Mr. Dewey married Irene Schroeder in Sabin, Minnesota on October 18, 1913. They had four children, Ronald, Elizabeth, Dorothy, and Marian. He learned the photography business with his father Arthur in Jamestown, opening the Dewey Studio in Fargo in 1908. His father joined him in Fargo shortly thereafter and they continued in partnership until his father's death in 1925. During World War I Dewey joined with Clifton Voss and began working with other Fargo photographers Voss and Scherling. Archie Dewey died on August 14, 1967. Dewey had served as president of the Photographers' Association of America. During his years as a photographer, Dewey won numerous awards including one from the PAA in 1962 for his services to state photographers. This was the first such award made in North Dakota..

Arthur W. Dewey was born on July 25, 1960 in Arcadia, Wisconsin. In April 1879, his family moved to Jamestown, North Dakota, and he lived one mile south of the city. During this time he hauled freight to the Fort Totten Indian Reservation by team. In 1883, Mr. Dewey opened a photography studio in Jamestown. He married Mary A. McGregor on November 18, 1885, and they and their children Archie and Irene lived at 1119 Ninth Street North in Fargo. On July 17, 1908 Mr. Dewey moved to Fargo and with his son opened Dewey Studio in the Edwards Block. Arthur Dewey died of pneumonia at his home on July 17, 1925. Mrs. Dewey died in 1942.

Dorge, Elias G. E., 1863-1915

Business address: 112 Broadway/56 Kaufman Block (1912); 612 Front Street (1913-1915)

Business years: 1911-1915

Elias G. Dorge was born in Stavanger, Norway on February 6, 1863 and immigrated to America in 1881. He lived in Brooklyn, New York for two years before moving on to Minneapolis, Minnesota, where he worked as a photographer for twenty-eight years. He was married to Dorthea Batne who had come from Stavanger in 1885. Dorge came to Fargo in 1911 first as a partner in Dorge & Jansrud photography, located at 112 Broadway and 56 Kaufman Block. In 1913 Dorge is listed as being on his own at 612 Front Street. Dorge died suddenly of heart failure on May 3, 1915. His wife died in February 1920 in Minneapolis.

Drysdale, James S.

Business address: 75 Edwards Block

Business years: 1905-1907

James S. Drysdale was born in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada in 1862. He came to America and settled in Minneapolis in about 1890. James married Amanda Michelson in 1892, and with her raised two children, Myrtle and Myra. Prior to coming to Fargo in 1905, James worked as a traveling salesman for O. H. Peck Company. James Drysdale took over the photography business from John J. Freeman who had died two years earlier. Drysdale also taught photography at the Northern School of Photography. He left Fargo in about 1907. No more information is known about James S. Drysdale.

Duffy, George E.

Business address: 118 Broadway

Business years: 1916

George E. Duffy was first listed in the Fargo city directories as a plumber in 1913. In 1916 he had a photography business at 118 Broadway. He disappeared from Fargo after that.

Electric Studio

See Charles E. Reed

Ellingson & Laurens

Business address: Unknown Business years: Late 1880s

The only information for this photography studio is a cabinet card photograph held in private hands of an unknown family. The studio imprint at the bottom of the image reads "Ellingson & Laurens, Fargo, Dakota." Mr. Ellingson's name does not appear in any Fargo city directory or North Dakota business gazetteer, thus no additional information is known about him, even his first name. Presumably the firm was in business for only a short time, likely between 1887 and 1889, prior to North Dakota statehood. See also entry for A. Laurens who apparently also operated his own studio in Fargo.

Erickson, Soren O., 1875 - ca. 1915

Business address: 305 NP Avenue Business years: 1904-1915

Soren O. Erickson was born on May 9, 1875 in Norway. In 1884 he came with his parents to Eureka, Kansas where he was educated in the photography profession in 1897. He lived in Little Falls, Minnesota and Ashland, Wisconsin before settling in Fargo in 1901. During his first few years in Fargo, he worked as an employee of photographer T.M. Swem. In about 1904, Mr. Erickson opened his own studio at 305 NP Avenue. An ad in the July 19, 1907 Fargo Forum & Daily Republican stated that Mr. Erickson worked under the motto "My work never disappoints." Soren Erickson was married to Petrina J. Sundstad in 1907. Petrina was born on February 2, 1872 in Leirfjord, Norway. She came with her parents to Perley, Minnesota in 1882. In the 1890s she moved to Fargo and worked as a dressmaker up until the time of her marriage. Soren and Petrina and two daughters, Solveig, and -----. It is assumed that Soren Erickson died

in 1915, since his name disappears from the city directory at this time. The 1916 business gazetteer shows Petrina as operating the business. After 1916, the Erickson's studio is no longer listed. Petrina Erickson died on July 17, 1955 in Fargo. It appears that Mr. Erickson also operated a studio in Barnesville, as a stamp on a photograph in the Institute for Regional Studies collection reads "Erickson Studio Fargo & Barnesville" (51.111.14).

Essery, Joseph

Business address: 1st Avenue Between Broadway and Roberts Street (1882-1883); 618 First Avenue (1884) Business years: 1882-1884

According to the 1882 and 1883 city directories, Joseph Essery first operated a studio on 1st Avenue between Broadway and Roberts Street in Fargo. In 1884 he had moved further down 1st Avenue to 618. He also lived at the same locations. No additional information has been found regarding Mr. Essery, and he was not listed in the 1885 census.

Fargo Film Finishing Company

Business address: 609 2nd Ave. North (1927-1938); 20 1/2 Broadway (1940)

Business years: 1927-1940

The Fargo Film Finishing Company's advertising slogan was "Demand our trade-marked prints from your druggist." The company was founded in 1926 with partners, Owen M. Hostler and H. W. Headen. Mr. Hostler had move that year to Fargo from Jamestown, N.D. where he had been a salesman for retail drugs. In the 1928 city directory Headen is replaced by T. Lawton MacDonald, and by 1930 only Hostler's name is given, as manager. The 1929 Fargo telephone directory gives the business address as 608 Front Street. In 1940, after fire destroyed the business, he moved to Watford City, N.D. and established Owen's Studio. He continued in business until 1969 when he was forced to retire due to ill health. Owen M. Hostler came to Fargo in 1926 from Jamestown, North Dakota. He was born January 22, 1894 at Ida Grove, Iowa and moved with his parents as a boy to Jamestown. At Jamestown, Mr. Hostler also played with a theater group and professional dance orchestra. He married Ellen M. Peterson, and they had a daughter Elaine and a son. In 1938 he married Cathryn Yoerg of McKenzie County, N.D., and they raised two daughters, Diane, and Amy. Mr. Hostler died at Watford City, N.D. on April 4, 1974.

Ferguson, Ed See R-F Aero Photo

Flaten, Gilbert E., 1856-1896

Business address: 506 Front Street (late 1880s); 722 Front Street (1890-1893); 67 Broadway (1895-1896) Business years: late 1880s-1896

Gilbert E. Flaten was born in Vang in Valdres, Norway on August 21, 1856. He came to the United States in 1882 and settled in Fargo shortly thereafter. He first worked with his brother O.E. Flaten in a studio located in Moorhead, Minnesota in 1884. Mr. Flaten was married to Emma Voxland on August 4, 1891, and they had two children. Sometime in the late 1880s, Flaten opened his own studio at 506 Front Street, which for a time was advertised as Flaten Brothers. In May 1890 he took over the Haynes studio at 722 Front Street and in 1895 moved the studio to 67 Broadway. Mr. Flaten appeared to have been very active in the community. He was a member of the Key city Hook & Ladder, the A..O.U.W., the Macabees, and the Foresters. Mr. Flaten died in Fargo of typhoid pneumonia on February 25, 1896.

Follett Studios

Business address: 910 7th Avenue North

Business years: 1953

Margaret M. Lehr was born on March 16, 1915 in Fargo. She grew up in Fargo and graduated from Central High. She owned and operated Follett Studio's in the 1950s. In 1956 she moved to Moorhead where she died on July 8, 1989.

Forum Publishing Company

Business address: 101 5th Street North Business years: 1891- [present]

It is not known when the Fargo Forum first used its own reporters to take photographs for news stories, but in 1929 they did own an old Graflex focal plane camera that was dusty and out of order, indicating its lack of use. Long-time Forum reporter Roy P. Johnson took his first photographs for the newspaper in about 1932. Until 1935 commercial photographers had supplied indoor photographs published in the newspaper. That changed when reporter Roy P. Johnson first used flash photography in the Cass County Courthouse. By 1938 the newspaper moved into photography in earnest when it purchased the necessary photography equipment and trained reporters and staff in its use. That same year the Forum acquired the Dakota Photo Engraving Company that supplied engravings for the newspaper. Early reporters were responsible for their own photography and the negatives were developed and printed by Fargo and Moorhead commercial studios. This arrangement did not prove to be satisfactory and they built their own darkroom. By 1952 there was a separate photography department operated by Forum staff.

Many reporters who took their own photographs and full-time photographers have been associated with the Forum over the years. The following incomplete list of Forum staff includes those known to have done photography for the newspaper. It also includes years of employment, when known: Kenneth W. Bergan (1951), Bill Bitters (1953), Nick Carlson, Bruce Crummy, Ed Dams (1957-), Eugene Fitzgerald, Chet Gebert, Gifford Herron (1934-1968), Colburn Hvidston III, Harry Jennings (1958-1976), Roy P. Johnson (1927-1963), Phil Mathews (1952-), Alf T. Olsen, Cal Olson, David Wallis, and Edward Yocum.

Foseide, John

Business address: Unknown

Business years: 1886 (as Wigness & Foseide)

Little is known of John Foseide. He was found in the 1886 business gazetteer working as a partner with John T. Wigness in Wigness & Foseide.

Freeman, John J.

Business address: 75 Edwards Block

Business years: 1904-1905

Little is known of John J. Freeman. He is listed in the 1904 city directory as having a studio in the Edwards Block. The following year his wife operated the studio. According to the city directories, the Freemans were living in Grand Forks. Mr. Freeman died around 1905, and the studio was taken over by James S. Drysdale.

Genelli Studio See Walter H. Schramm

Glesta, John "Jack," 1891-

Business address: 613 1st Avenue North Business years: 1919-1920 (with C.E. Reed)

Mr. Glesta was born in October of 1891 in North Dakota. According to the 1900 census, his family lived in Valley City. He worked with Charles E. Reed in 1919-1920 and lived at 571 3rd Street in Fargo.

Goodfellow, Laura, 1881-

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1910

Laura Goodfellow was born in about 1881 in Canada. The 1910 census states that she was a self-employed photographer with her own studio. She was a roomer at 515 7th Street South in Fargo. Nothing else is known of her.

Greene, H. S.

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1894

Little is known of H.S. Greene. He is listed as a Fargo photographer in 1894. His photographic work was displayed in the June 7, 1894 fire anniversary edition of *The Argus* newspaper. It is believed that he moved to Billings, Montana but did not remain there long.

Grosz, Richard T., 1906-1972

Business address: 1009 So. 4th Street (1934-1936); 16-22 Broadway (Herbst Dept. Store, 1936-1937)

Business years: 1934-1937

Richard T. Grosz was born in New Leipzig, North Dakota on March 22, 1906. He came to Fargo in 1926 with the intention of joining the U.S. Navy, but instead he became interested in photography. On May 1, 1927 he married Hazel Hammer of Fertile, Minnesota. They had six children. During his first few years in Fargo, he worked on an ice crew until his business was able to support itself. His first studio was located in the basement of his home at 1009 South 4th Street in Fargo. In 1936 he moved his studio to the basement of the Herbst Department Store. In 1937 he moved his business over to Moorhead, Minnesota where he bought the Flaten-Oloye Studio at 405 Center Avenue. He once again moved his studio to 610 Center Avenue in 1942. It remained at this site until it was destroyed by fire on October 30, 1967. Many irreplaceable negative files were lost in this fire, including many historic glass negatives belonging to O.E. Flaten. A new studio was constructed at 202 8th Street South. In 1967, Richard's son David became a partner with his father, and he took over the business in 1970. Richard Grosz died on June 28, 1972.

Hagen, Oscar A., ca. 1894 - ca. 1931

Business address: 303 Broadway (1915-1916) Business years: 1915-1916 (as Hagen & Slaten)

Oscar A. Hagen was born in about 1894 in Wisconsin. Little is known of Mr. Hagen. The city directories first show him as a lunch room worker in 1909. Then in 1910, he is listed as the proprietor of the Last Chance Restaurant. He was married to Gertie, and they had a child named Margaret. He is listed in 1915 and 1916 as a photographer. In 1916 he is listed with an Albert Slaten as a partner. Thereafter he is associated with restaurant work. In 1932 Gertie is listed as a widow, so apparently Oscar died sometime around this time.

Hamre, Nels P., 1877-1940

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1909-1910

Nels P. Hamre was born on October 2, 1877 in Selje, Nordfjording, Norway. In 1880 he came to America with his parents at the age of 2 1/2 years old, and they settled near Benson, Minnesota. When he was in his teens he lost his lower leg in a binder accident. While in the hospital recuperating, he met a young woman named (Anna) Ellen Johnson. They were married on May 22, 1907, and together they had one daughter

named Vivian. Nels apprenticed under a photographer in Benson, and then around 1909 moved to Fargo and set up a partnership with another photographer. In 1910, he bought a studio in Aneta, North Dakota from David Anderson. His business was rather slow until a train ran into a flock of sheep south of Aneta. Nels went and took pictures of the scene and sold them for \$2.00 a dozen. This incident seemed to establish him as a competent photographer. Many of Mr. Hamre's photos can be seen in the *Norwegian Farmers in U.S.* Nels Hamre died February 3, 1940 in Aneta.

Hansen, Hans T., 1865-1941

Business address: Broadway & 2nd Avenue North (1891); 101 Broadway (1893); 508 Front Street (1895-1898); 205 N.P. Avenue (1898-1902); Smith Block (1904); 230 Broadway (1905-1909); 409 N.P. Avenue (1910-1913); 318 1/2 Broadway (1915); with McCracken (1919-1928); 64 1/2 Broadway (1930) Business years: 1891-1930; 1893 (as Logan & Hanson), 1896-1897 (as Hanson & Stene), 1899-1900 (as Hanson & Reis), 1909 (as Hansen & Rudd)

Hans T. Hansen was born on September 16, 1865 on a farm near Albert Lea, Minnesota. Early on in his career, Hans built himself a traveling studio and hired a livery team to move it from town to town. His travels took him up to Ada, Minnesota where he met Inger Sarina (Torvestaad) Nelson who was working for distant relatives of his on a farm near the Red River. Inger was born in Norway in 1870 and had come to Minnesota in 1887. Hans and Inger were married on June 25, 1890. After their marriage Hans continued to be a traveling photographer until their first child Harry was born in Hope, N.D. The family then settled in Fargo in 1891 where Hans and Inger raised five children: Harry, Lillian, Clarence, Lester, and Edward. Hans's first photograph studio was located at the corner of Second Avenue North and Broadway. The June 1893 fire consumed his own business, yet a photograph of the aftermath of the fire has Logan & Hanson embossed upon it. The 1893 directory states he is an "operator" at the studio of James R. Logan. At the time of the fire he was also assistant chief of the Continental Hose Company and fought the great Fargo blaze. After the fire the family toured North Dakota in a photography car, similar to a cook car, outfitted with a skylight and all equipment to finish pictures. They returned that same fall in 1893 and established a new photography business, but he apparently continued to operate a traveling studio for he opened a photo car at Cooperstown, N.D. in September 1894. For many years he used the name Hanson, but later changed his last name to Hansen because there were so many Hanson's. He appears again in the 1895-1896 Fargo city directory as having his own studio at 508 Front Street with Theodor Larssen, but by 1896 he is in partnership with Robert M. Stene as Hanson & Stene. In 1898 he relocated his business to 205 N.P. Avenue and was in partnership with Carl J. Reis as Hansen & Reis. Mr. Reis left the partnership shortly after 1900, and Hans continued on his own at this location until 1905 when he moved to 230 Broadway. Hans then when into partnership with Harold M. Rudd, and the 1909 city directory lists the firm as Hansen & Rudd. By 1910 Rudd was no longer in partnership and Hans had moved to 409 N.P. Avenue, where the studio went under the names "Hansen's Photograph Gallery" and "The New Studio." The family lived on the second story at the same address. By 1915 he moved his business to 318 1/2 Broadway and by 1919 he was working for photographer Elwin B. McCracken. Around 1930 Hansen again operated his own studio at 64 1/2 Broadway for a short time, and by 1932 he apparently retired. Due to poor health he and his family, except son Lester, moved to California in 1932 where Hans and Inger settled in Santa Monica. He died on August 4, 1941 in Los Angeles, and Inger died on January 20, 1956.

Harold's Studio

Business years: 1948-1952

Harold Becko lived in Winona, Minnesota, and is listed as owning Harold's Studio. His studio was managed by Henry LeCocq of Moorhead, Minnesota, who bought it in 1952. His advertisement stated he 'specialized in children."

Harter, John, ca. 1895-

Business address: Unknown

Business years: 1920

John Harter is listed in the 1920 census as a photographer. He was born in Indiana in about 1895. He, his wife Mary, and their daughter Evelyn lived at 101 8th Street. Nothing else is known of him.

Hartman, William D., 1873-1948

Business address: 619 1st Avenue North (1924); 617 1/2 1st Avenue North (1927-1934)

Business years: 1924-1934 (New Garden Studio)

William D. Hartman was born on September 31, 1873, in Ridgefield, Illinois. He graduated from the University of Minnesota and was employed in Minneapolis before moving to Valley City, North Dakota. He was a teacher at the Valley City State Teachers College. In 1914, William married Josie C. Arneson and moved to Fargo. With Josie they had a daughter named Patricia. William worked as a salesman for the Eastman Kodak Company for 35 years. In about 1924, William and Josie opened the New Garden Studio at 617 1/2 1st Avenue North. In about 1934, the studio was sold to Clifton L. Voss. William retired from the Eastman Kodak Company in 1947. He died in Valley City on July 13, 1948. Mrs. Hartman died at her daughter's home in Marion, North Carolina on October 6, 1957.

Haynes, Frank J., 1853-1921

Business address: 725 Front Street Business years: 1879-1889

Frank J. Haynes was born in Saline, Michigan, on October 28, 1853. In 1876 Frank Haynes moved to Moorhead, Minnesota where he opened his first studio. The next year he traveled 400 miles by stagecoach photographing the Dakota Territory. He married Lily V. Snyder on Jan 15, 1878, and in that same year he made a photographic journey to the West Coast. In 1879 Haynes moved his business to Fargo at 725 Front Street. In 1881 Haynes made his first trip to Yellowstone Park where he made a collection of stereoscopic views, and eventually he opened a park concession to sell pictures. Haynes was asked to take photographs of several historic occasions. First, when U.S. President Arthur toured Yellowstone Park in 1883, Haynes was asked to take the pictures. When the golden spike was driven linking the east and west Northern Pacific railroad in 1883, Haynes was commissioned to take the photographs, and he was also asked to become the official photographer of the Northern Pacific Railroad. Haynes also outfitted a Palace train car into a photo studio, which he used to photograph towns from Puget Sound to Chicago. In 1889, Haynes moved his studio to St. Paul, Minnesota. He continued his adventurous trips to Yellowstone and helped develop its large tourist business. He died on March 10, 1921 in St. Paul.

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Heaton, Frank C., ca. 1892-

Business address: 613 1st Avenue

Business years: 1920-1922 (as Heaton & Poague)

Frank Heaton was born in about 1892 in Illinois. He is listed in the 1915 city directory as working as a bookkeeper at the Merchants National Bank and living at the Prescott Hotel. In 1916 he is listed as a clerk at the Prescott Hotel and living at 600 10th Street South. In 1919 he is listed as a cashier at the

Scandinavian American Bank and living with his father James L. Heaton at 313 9th Street South. It appears that Frank was married but he was a widower by 1920. He is listed as a photographer in the 1922 Fargo city directory as a partner of Harry Poague. In 1922, Mr. Heaton was living at 1502 1st Avenue South in Fargo. After 1922 he is no longer listed as living in Fargo.

Hubertz, John A., 1870-1955

Business address: 618 2nd Avenue North (as Electric Light Studio, 1907-1911); 56 Broadway (1913); 612 1/2 Front Street (1917-1919); 604 1/2 Front Street (1922-1932); 602 1/2 Front Street (1934-1936) Business years: 1907-1936

John Hubertz was born on April 6, 1870 in Kentland, Indiana. Mr. Hubertz was educated in Indiana and married Theresa Benner in 1895. They had four children: Gerald, who died in WWI, Herbert, Rita, and Ramona. In 1897 they moved to Des Moines, Iowa. John came to Fargo in 1898 and worked for photographer C.F. Stene, and in 1904 he is listed as a manager at the J.J Freeman Studio in the Edwards Block. In 1907 he opened his own business at 618 2nd Avenue North and named it the "Electric Light Studio" after his method of using the new electric light method. The business moved to several different locations in Fargo, finally ending up at 604 1/2 Front Street. Around 1938 Mr. and Mrs. Hubertz moved to Fowler, Indiana. Mrs. Hubertz died in 1948, and John moved to Jacksonville, Florida to be near his daughter Rita. He died there on April 28, 1955. Both Mr. and Mrs. Hubertz were buried in Holy Cross Cemetery in Fargo.

Jansrud, John C., ca. 1872-

Business address: 112 Broadway Business years: 1910-1914

John C. Jansrud was born in about 1872 in Norway. He immigrated to the United States in 1887 and operated a Studio in Mayville from about 1904-1910. In 1910 he opened Jansrud Photo Studio at 112 Broadway. After 1914, Mr. Jansrud is no longer found in Fargo.

Business address: 322 5th Street North (Universal Building, 1910-1971); 1521 3rd Street North (1971-1977); 510 10th Avenue North (1977-present) Business years: 1970- [present]

James M. Olson, a Fargo native, was raised in south Fargo and attended public and parochial schools. He enrolled in North Dakota State University in 1965. In 1967 he entered the North Dakota Air National Guard where he eventually worked in the photograph laboratory until retiring in 1987. Upon returning to Fargo in 1968 he continued his education at NDSU and worked as a student in the photo lab of the Extension Service until graduating in 1970. He opened JMO Productions in 1970 and after several years changed the name to JMO Photography. Beginning in film processing and slide productions, the business evolved into all facets of commercial and portrait photography, along with custom black & white processing and virtually all types of copy work. Jim Olson is married to Jean Bladow from Hankinson, N.D., and they have two children, Brent and Bryan.

Johnson, Peter A.

Business address: 65 1/2 Broadway

Business years: 1901

Peter A. Johnson, a native Minnesotan, bought the Judd studio at 65 1/2 Broadway in about 1901. He is not listed again after 1901.

Judd, Charles L., 1856-

Business address: 65 1/2 Broadway

Business years: 1896-1900

Charles L. Judd was born in Wisconsin in April 1856. He was a photographer in Jamestown, North Dakota from about 1884 until coming to Fargo in 1896. His studio is listed at 65 1/2 Broadway in Fargo city directories from 1898 to 1900. He married Winifred in about 1893. In 1901 his business was sold to Peter A. Johnson.

Kahlert, Albert H.

Business address: 506 Front Street

Business years: 1891-1892 (Lane's Photograph Gallery)

Albert H. Kahlert was the manager of Lane's Photograph Gallery. He lived at the Hotel Cantieny. Nothing else is known of him.

Keck, Albert L.

Business address: 201 Broadway

Business years: 1906

Albert L. Keck is found in the 1906 Polk Business Gazetteer at 201 Broadway. No other reference to him can be found.

Lane's Photograph Gallery

Business address: 506 Front Street Business years: 1891-1892

William J. Lane was born on March 23, 1967 in Newark, New Jersey. Mr. Lane was educated in his hometown up to the age of eleven, when he dropped out of school and started working for a local crockery store. Later he served as an office boy and finally became an employee of the American Tract Society in New York City. He came to Fargo in 1886, where he was first employed in a mortgage and loan business, and then he worked for the First National Bank of Fargo from 1887 to 1897. From 1891-1892 he was the owner the Lane's Photograph Gallery with A.H. Kahlert as manager. He later went on to work for the Fargo Loan Agency from 1897 to 1902. He was engaged in the real estate business prior to starting his own business called the W.J. Lane Company in 1916. Mr. Lane also served as the director of the Fargo YMCA for twenty years. He was also very active in community and religious affairs of the Presbyterian Church. Mr. Lane was married to Elizabeth Benson on July 13, 1892, and they had four children named Florence, Clinton Clarence, Rose, and Dorothy. William J. Lane died during a speaking engagement in Devils Lake, North Dakota on October 15, 1931.

Albert H. Kahlert, in 1896, established a photograph studio in the newly established town of Climax, Minnesota. He operated the studio until in the early 1900s when a fire consumed the family house-studio-hotel building. Mr. Kahlert married Nellie Erickson in 1895 at St. Paul, Minnesota, and they had two daughters, Mildred and Adeline. After the fire Albert and Nellie split up, and he operated a saloon in Crookston, Minn. He later moved to Lewiston, Idaho where he died in 1921.

Langness, Duane E.

7th Street (1978-1985) Business years: 1971-1985 Duane E. Langness was born in Fargo in about 1948 to Purden Sigfred and Rose Langness. In 1971 he opened a studio at 515 South University Drive. He began working out of his home in 1974. In 1985 the city directory lists him as a musician, and in 1989 as a contractor. His wife's name was Elaine, and they had three children named Paul, Tonya, and Eric.

Larssen, Theodor

Business address: 508 Front Street (1895-1896); 65 1/2 Broadway (1896-1897) Business years: 1895-1896 (Hans T. Hanson), 1896-1897 (Reis & Larssen)

Theodor Larssen first worked in Moorhead, Minnesota for O. E. Flaten as a retoucher in 1893. In 1895-1896 he was a retoucher for Hans T. Hanson. In 1896-1897 he went into business with Carl J. Reis, opening a studio at 65 1/2 Broadway. In 1898-1899 he was working for O. E. Flaten again in Moorhead. After 1899 Mr. Larssen can no longer be found in either the Fargo or Moorhead city directory.

Laurens, A.

Business address: 506 Front Street

Business years: 1880s

Information on this photographer comes from a cabinet card photograph in private hands. The front of the card reads "A. Laurens, 506 Front Street, Fargo, Dak." This address was the home of Lane's Gallery in 1891-1892. A. Laurens is not found in any reference source. Another photograph in private hands lists Laurens as a partner in Ellingson & Laurens also in Fargo, Dakota, but no address or date is given.

LeCocq, Henry

Business years: 1950-1953

Henry LeCocq first showed up in 1950 as a photographer for Harold's Studio. In 1952, Mr. LeCocq took over Harold's Studio and renamed it LeCocq Studio. After 1953 the studio was no longer in business, and Mr. LeCocq was no longer living in Fargo. His wife's name was Bernice.

Lockwood, J. P., Mrs.

Business address: Smith Block

Business years: 1898-1899 (A. A. Bentley & Company)

Mrs. J. P. Lockwood is listed in the Fargo city directories as working for A. A. Bentley & Company from 1898-1899. A Miss Sarah M. Lockwood is listed as an artist in the 1899-1900 directory. There was also a woman by the name of M.R. Lockwood who is listed in the 1885 Census and living in Lisbon, North Dakota as an artist. Whether these two other women are somehow related to Mrs. J.P. Lockwood is unknown.

Logan, Samuel H., 1864-1892

Business address: 204 Broadway (1884-1887), 101 Broadway (1889-1892)

Business years: 1882-1892 (1885 as Bestic & Logan)

Samuel H. Logan was born in October, 1864 in Galt, Ontario, Canada. He was first listed in the 1882 Fargo city directory as a photo printer, and in 1883 he is listed as an artist. By 1884 he was an employee of the F.J. Haynes Studio. He went into partnership with Arthur E. Bestic as Bestic & Logan circa 1884, opening a studio at 204 Broadway. His studio circa 1889 had changed locations to 101 Broadway and he had branch galleries at Lisbon and Casselton, North Dakota. In the fall of 1891 his health began to decline,

and he turned his business over to his brother James R. Logan. Samuel H. Logan died in Fargo on April 9, 1892.

Logan, James R., ca. 1896-

Business address: 101 Broadway

Business years: 1892-1893, 1893 (as Logan & Hansen)

The brother of Samuel H. Logan, James R. Logan was born in about 1866 in Canada. He is first listed in the 1883 Fargo city directory as a teamster. He then worked as a clerk for the Northern Pacific Railroad until his brother's death in 1892. At that time he took over his brother's photographic studio. After the Fargo fire of 1893, he went into partnership with Hans T. Hanson. That October a Cooperstown, N.D. newspaper states he had arrived there and opened a photo gallery across from the Palace Hotel. He no longer operated the studio in 1895, as he was then listed as a clerk with Yoder & Lewis. After 1896 Mr. Logan was no longer living in Fargo.

Lovelace, Larry G.

Business years: 1968 -1974 (Quality Portraits)

Larry G. Lovelace operated Quality Portraits from 1968-1974. In 1975 he went to work for Gillespie Studio in Moorhead. From 1981 to 1986 he was a salesman for North Dakota Mutual Insurance. After 1986, Mr. Lovelace was no longer living in Fargo. His wife's name was Geraldine, and had one son named Michael.

Lovell, John S.

Business address: Unknown Business years: Before 1889

Two photographs are found in the Institute for Regional Studies collection (Folio 82) with imprint, "Photographed by Lovell, Fargo, D.T." The second image also includes "Jamestown, D.T." A John S. Lovell is listed as a photographer in Jamestown, N.D. in 1884. He does not appear on the 1885 Dakota Territory census. Nothing more is known about Lovell.

Martin, Joseph, ca. 1843

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1885

Joseph Martin was born in Canada. He is listed in the 1885 census as a photographer in Fargo when he was 43 years old. Nothing else is known of him.

McCracken's Studio

Business address: 112 1/2 Broadway (1915-1924 and 1930-1934); 110 1/2 Broadway (1924-1930 and

1934-1952)

Business years: 1915-1952

Elwin B. McCracken was born in Iowa on March 18, 1876. He married Bessie Gormley in Crookston, Minnesota on November 26, 1905, and they had seven children named Elizabeth, Robert, Ada, David, Donald, Richard, and Nora. He started a photography studio in Buffalo, North Dakota around 1914. In 1915 he moved his studio to 112 1/2 Broadway in Fargo. He operated this studio until turning it over to his son Robert in the 1940s. Elwin McCracken moved to the West Coast and died on August 27, 1969 in Kent, Washington. Mrs. McCracken died there in 1957.

Robert E. McCracken was born in 1915. In 1948, Robert sold the business to Homer Thune who had apprenticed at the studio, and he and his wife Olive settled in Hayward, California. Mr. Thune retained the McCracken name until about 1952 when he changed it to Thune Photography.

McCracken, Donald E.

Business address: 813 North 10th Street

Business years: 1971- [present] (as Olmstead & McCracken 1971-1981)

Donald E. McCracken was the grandson of Elwin B. McCracken and the son of Donald and Irene McCracken. He was married to Karen, and they have three children named Cheryl, Donald, and Iver. He was a partner of Dean Olmstead from 1971 to 1981 when he took over the business.

Miller, George

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1920

George Miller was born around 1898 in Illinois. In the 1920 census he is listed as a photographer and living as a boarder at 407 NP Avenue. He may have worked for C.E. Reed because they both were boarders at the same location.

Musselman, Frank E., ca. 1888-

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1910

According to the 1910 census, Frank E. Musselman owned a photography business in Fargo. He was born around 1888 in Kansas. In 1910 he was a boarder at 208 Broadway. Little else is known of him.

Nevins Sisters

"Nevins Sisters, Fargo, N.D." is found imprinted on a photograph of a Spanish American War soldier in the Institute for Regional Studies photograph collection (51.111.8). No additional information is known about them.

New Garden Studio

Olmstead, Dean, 1930-

Business address: 813 North 10th Street

Business years: 1962-1981, (as Olmstead-McCracken Studio 1971-1981)

Sherry Dean Olmstead was born in Forman, North Dakota on July 27, 1930 to Orville E. and Amelia Olmstead. He was first found in the city directory working for the Fargo Foundry Company in 1950. He served in the United States Navy during the Korean War from 1952 to 1954. From 1957 to 1958 he worked for Scherling Studio, and from 1959 to 1960 Mr. Olmstead worked for Shirley-Onstad as a salesman. He had a photography studio at 813 North 10th Street from 1962 to 1981. In 1971 Donald E. McCracken joined his business and later took it over in 1981. His wife's name is Marion.. Mr. Olmstead now lives at Lake Park, Minnesota.

Olson, Andrew C., 1876-

Business address: 224 NP Avenue (1899-1902); Smith Block (1902)

Business years: 1899-1902

Andrew C. Olson was born in January of 1876 in Norway. He came to America in 1892. According to the 1900 Fargo directory, he boarded at 414 4th Street North in Fargo. In the 1900 census, a Mike Olsen is listed at the same address and is most likely the same person. He was a partner with Wallace D. Barnes from 1899 to 1900. Thereafter he worked on his own until 1902. After 1900 he disappears from the city directories.

Olson, Daniel E., 1915-1966

Business address: 1341 South 10th Street (1948-1960); 1203 16th Avenue South (1961-1966)

Business years: 1940-1966

Daniel E. Olson was born on December 7, 1915 in Bagley, Minnesota. He lived in Jamestown, North Dakota before coming to Fargo in 1931. He was educated at Fargo Central High School, Los Angeles Institute of Photography, Los Angeles Art Center School and the Winona, Illinois School of Photography. He married Ellen Marie Endersbee on December 30, 1950. They and their three children Mary Ellen, Jeanne, and Earl lived in Fargo where Mr. Olson worked out of a studio at his home. He was a Commercial Council member for the North Dakota Professional Photographers of America, and past president of Professional Photographers of North Dakota. He was very active in Fargo community affairs. During his years as a photographer, Mr. Olson photographed Presidents Eisenhower, Kennedy, and Governor Nelson Rockefeller. He died on September 9, 1966 in Fargo at the age of 50. After his death, Ellen continued on with the studio until 1974. She died on October 11, 1991 in Minneapolis.

Pitsch, Nicholas E., ca. 1878-

Business years: 1910-1920

Nicholas E. Pitsch was born in about 1878 in Michigan. A 1907 photograph in the Institute collection places Pitsch at Finley, North Dakota in 1907. He is first listed in a Fargo city directory in 1909. He opened a studio at 230 Broadway, and around 1919 he moved his studio to 414 Broadway. His business was given as Pitsch's Photo Shop on a 1912 image. In the 1920 census he is listed being single. He is no longer found in Fargo after 1920.

Poague, Harry H., ca. 1898-

Business address: 613 1st Avenue North

Business years: 1920-1922 (as Heaton & Poague)

Harry H. Poague was born in Ohio around 1898. According to the 1920 census, he was married to a woman named Fanny and had one daughter named Dorothy, who was born in Iowa. He was first listed in the 1919 Fargo city directory as a manager for Charles E. Reed. In about 1920 he opened a photography studio with Frank C. Heaton that was located at 613 1st Avenue North. This studio is last listed in the 1922 city directory. After that Mr. Poague can no longer be found.

Prairie Photography

Business years: 1973-1979

George Rohde operated Prairie Photography from 1973 to 1979. He was born in about 1945 to Lester and Amy Rohde in Fargo. His wife's name was Beverly, and they had three children named Jill, Christopher, and Angela. After he operated Prairie Photography, Mr. Rohde was employed by Down Comfort from 1980 to 1981. He then opened Gallery West in 1982.

R-F Aero Photo

Business years: 1979-1980

Ed Ferguson operated an aerial photography service according to the 1979 and 1980 Fargo city directories. No additional information is known about Mr. Ferguson or the business.

Redd, J. O.

Business address: Smith Block

Business years: 1896-1899 (at A.A. Bentley & Company)

J.O. Redd is listed as a photographer with the Arthur A. Bentley Company. In the 1899-1900 city directory he is listed as a travel agent, living at 115 Broadway.

Reed, Charles E.

Business address: 509 NP Avenue (1912-1916); 71 Broadway (1916-1917); 613 1st Avenue North (1919);

617 1st Avenue North (1921)

Business years: 1912 (Reed Bell Company) 1914-1921

Charles E. Reed is listed in the 1920 census as being in his 30s and born in Wisconsin. He was also listed as a widower. He is first found as a Fargo photographer in the 1912 business gazetteer as a president in the Reed Bell Company, which was located at 509 NP Avenue. In 1916 he is listed on his own at 71 Broadway, and in the 1919 city directory he is located at 613 1st Avenue North, and in 1921 at 617 1st Avenue North. The business gazetteer sometimes lists him as Edward C. or C. Edward Reed. An imprint on a photograph in private hands gives his business as the "Electric Studio."

Reis, Carl J., 1873-

Business address: 722 Front Street (1891-1893); 67 Broadway (1895-1896); 65 1/2 Broadway (1896-1897); Smith Block (1898-1899); 205 NP Avenue (1899-1901)
Business years: 1891-1896 (G. E. Flaten), 1896-1897 (Reis & Larssen), 1898-1899 (A. A. Bentley & Company), 1899-1901 (Hanson & Reis)

Carl J. Reis was born in October, 1873 in Norway. He immigrated with his family in 1883, settling in Willmar, Minnesota. In 1886 he moved to Fargo, where he worked as a photographer in the Gilbert E. Flaten studio in 1891. After Flaten died in 1896, Reis and Theodor Larssen went into business together for a year. Then Mr. Reis spent 1898 to 1899 with the A. A. Bentley & Company. In 1899, Carl J. Reis went into business with Hans T. Hanson. Carl Reis married Carrie in about 1896, and together they had six children. Mr. Reis was no longer in Fargo after 1901. In 1905 he homesteaded in Garness, Township, Burke County, North Dakota. He stayed there for only a short period of time before moving to Tompkins, Saskatchewan, Canada. He died there in the 1950s.

Rentschler, John J., 1857-1938

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1900

John J. Rentschler was born in Akron, Ohio on November 14, 1857. He was married to a woman named Elizabeth in about 1892, and they had two children named Marie and Philip. Mr. Rentschler is listed in the 1900 census as a photographer. He was a next-door neighbor to Charles F. Stene and may have been working for him at the time. He worked as a butcher for 50 years in Fargo. He died of a fall in his home on June 17, 1938.

Richardson, Ernest H., 1875-1941

Business address: Smith Block Business years: 1900-1901

Ernest H. Richardson was born at Old Orchard, Maine on November 22, 1875. He came to Fargo around December 1899 and took over the Charles Judd studio. In 1901 he married Florence Amelia Hamilton and together they had four children. Mr. Richardson left Fargo sometime around 1901. He was a photographer in Minnesota until 1917, when he moved to Ames, Iowa. In Ames he served as the Iowa State College photographer. Mr. Richardson died in Ames on May 18, 1941.

Rider, Fred W., 1881-1954

Fred W. Rider was born in Oak Grove, Wisconsin on March 6, 1881. He spent his childhood in Wisconsin and Elgin, Illinois. According to his obituary he came to Fargo in 1914 and for a time operated a photography studio in the Metropole Hotel. He is listed for the first time in the 1922 city directory. In 1923 he moved to California, where he continued his photography business until 1947, when he returned to Fargo to live with his daughter Fanny Gugel. He worked for a time at Scherling's Studio and then operated Smith Studio. He died on May 13, 1954 in Fargo.

Rotzien, Earl L.

Business address: 361 8th Avenue South Business years: 1955, 1960-1961

Earl L. Rotzien was born in Fargo after 1920 to John and Irene Rotzien. Scherling Studio first employed him as a finisher from 1945 to 1948. In 1952 he worked as a clerk at Grosz Studio. In 1955 he was an independent photographer working out of his home at 361 8th Avenue South. From 1956 to 1959 he worked as a roofer with Quinn Roofing Company. He operated a photography studio once again out of his home from 1960 to 1961. Colemans employed him as a maintenance worker from 1962 to 1968. From 1969 to 1979 he worked for EPCO Film Company, and from 1980 to his retirement in 1988 he worked in the camera department at JC Penney's. Earl is still living in Fargo.

Royal Tone Studio

Business address: 518 1st Ave. North

Business years: 1949

This studio is found listed only in the 1949 Fargo telephone directory and operated by R. G. Torgerson, The advertisement listed it handled commercial & portrait photography.

Rudd, Peter Axel, 1873-1957

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1900

Peter Rudd is listed in the 1900 census as a photographer. He was born on January 9, 1873 in Oslo, Norway. He came with his family to America in 1882 and settled in Fargo. From 1891 to 1909 he worked for the P.G. Dry Goods store, and in 1909 he opened his own dry goods store. From 1917 to 1924 he worked as a bookkeeper for Midland Produce Company. He attended chiropractic school, but by 1930 he was working as a bookkeeper once again at Sherwood Lumber. He worked there until his retirement in 1950. As a side job Peter worked as a musician. He married Ellen Olsen on August 24, 1899 in Fargo, and they had two sons named Rudolph and Millard. Peter died on October 10, 1957 at the age of 84.

Rudd, Harold M., 1875-1960

Business address: 230 Broadway Business years: 1909 (Hansen & Rudd)

Harold M. Rudd was born on October 22, 1875 in Norway. He came to America with his parents in 1882, first settling in Fargo. Harold married MagDelin Schwartz on May 3, 1908 in Fargo. They had two children named Delin and Velva. Harold learned the photography trade from Hans T. Hansen and operated a studio with him in 1909 at 230 Broadway. Prior to that, he operated studios in the North Dakota towns of Esmond, Buxton, Reynolds, and at Crookston and Halstad, Minnesota. One photograph places him in Reynolds in 1897, and a Cooperstown, N.D. newspaper in 1900 states Rudd of Halstad opened temporarily a photo gallery there. Harold's main line of business was as a musician. At the time that he was a photographer, his wife would run the studio while he was out performing. He served as orchestra leader at the Grand and Orpheum theaters. He served as the Fargo Civic Orchestra conductor from 1931 to 1937. He also taught music at Concordia College and at NDAC, where he organized the first band. He died on January 14, 1960.

Sample, Philmer A.

Business years: 1899

Philmer A. Sample is listed in the 1899-1900 Fargo city directory as a photographer at 508 Front Street. Nothing else is known of him.

Schad, August (Gustave) ca. 1868 -

Business address: 725 Front Street

Business years: 1885

August Schad is listed in the 1885 census as a photographer. He was born in Illinois in about 1868. In 1885 he was still living with his mother Minnie Schad on Front Street. The 1887 city directory has him working at 725 Front Street with his sister who is listed as an artist at that location.

Scherlings Studio

Business address: 113 1/2 Broadway (1920-1958); 313 Broadway (1959-1980); 2801 13th Avenue South

(1980-current)

Business years: 1920- [present]

The Scherling Studio dates back to 1919 when Arvid R. Scherling came to Fargo where he obtained an internship with Dewey Studio. In 1920 he opened his own studio at 113 1/2 Broadway, where in 1929 was also located the Owl Studio. For some years they also had a studio in Moorhead, Minnesota, managed by T.M. Fillmore. Arvid R. Scherling was born in Pillager, Minnesota on August 21, 1898. He began with photography in Little Falls, and Ortonville, Minnesota before coming to Fargo. On October 4, 1919 he married Sophia Wagner, and they had three children named Daniel, Mary, and Orlando. In 1949 Arvid

retired, turned the business over to his son Orlando, and moved to Los Angeles, California. In September, 1971 he returned to Fargo where he died on May 18, 1972. Mrs. Scherling died in 1984.

Orlando Scherling was born on August 12, 1921 in Fargo. He was a graduate of Fargo Central High in 1939 and attended North Dakota State University. He then spent one year at the School of Modern Photography in New York City. On December 28, 1941 he married Billiette Skjonsby, and they had five sons named Jerry, Steven, Michael, Patrick, and Larry. In 1949 he took over his father's business when his father retired and moved to California. He remained at 113 1/2 Broadway until 1958, when they consolidated with Voss Studio and moved to 313 Broadway. During the 1950s, Scherling opened branch studios in the Minnesota cities of Moorhead, Wadena, Marshall, and Minneapolis. He was the president of the North Dakota Professional Photographers Association in 1952, and was awarded a master's degree from the Professional Photographers of America in 1956. Orlando and Billiette divorced in the 1960s, and Orlando remarried Sheila Kay Walker on May 25, 1969. In the 1970s Orlando's sons Patrick and Larry joined the studio. In February, 1980 the Fargo studio moved to a new location at 280113th Avenue South. Orlando died at his home on December 22, 1994. Currently Patrick and Larry Scherling operate the studio.

Schoch, Louis ca. 1871-

Louis Schoch was born in Germany in about 1871 and immigrated to America in 1889. Around 1910 he opened Schoch Palace Photo Studio at 509 Broadway. He is last found listed in Fargo in 1914. In 1918 the business gazetteer listed him as a photographer in Hunter, North Dakota.

Schramm, Walter H., 1897-1974

Walter H. Schramm was born on November 18, 1897 in Leaf Valley, Minnesota. He was a graduate of

Winona School of Photography and operated studios in Omaha, Nebraska, Sioux City, Iowa, and Washington, D.C. In 1934 he came to Fargo and opened Genelli Studio. He was a photographer in Fargo until his death on February 16, 1974. In 1936 he was associated for a short time with Alfred Chial, the business called Chial-Genelli Studio. He advertised that he used "The Mirror Way, its the most modern method in photography today, exclusively owned." His wife's name was Dorothy, and they had no children.

Schulz, Paul G.

Business address: 2414 Broadway (1966-1973); 2604 Broadway (1974); Northport Shopping Center, 2500 Broadway (1975-1977); North University Drive and 25th Avenue (1978-1981); 2417 North University Drive (1982-1988)

Business years: 1966-1988

Paul G. Schulz was a Fargo photographer from 1966 to 1988. He opened a studio at 2414 Broadway in 1966. In 1974 he moved his studio to 2604 Broadway, and in 1975 to Northport Shopping Center. In 1978 he moved once again to North University Drive and 25th Avenue, and in 1982 to 2417 North University Drive. After 1988 he is no longer listed in the Fargo directories. His wife's name was Mary Jean. They had three children named Stacy, Greg, and Christine.

Skrivseth, Jacob L., 1853-

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1878-1879

Jacob L. Skrivseth was a Fargo photographer for a short time between 1878 to 1879. Skrivseth may have been the first photographer in Fargo, but his studio location is unknown. Jacob L. Skrivseth was born on December 26, 1853 in Nördmore, Norway. He came with his family to America in 1869. They first settled in Freeborn County, MN. Jacob Skrivseth was educated in Norway and Minnesota. He learned the photography trade in Albert Lea, MN. From there he moved to Fairbault, MN, then to Fargo around 1878 or 1879. In the fall of 1879, Skrivseth became a partner of O. E. Flaten in Moorhead, MN. The two men apparently built a traveling wagon with a built-in dark room. Flaten stayed in Moorhead and Skrivseth traveled throughout the Red River Valley shooting town and farm scenes. Flaten and Skrivseth also may have been the official photographers for the St. Paul, Minneapolis, and Manitoba Railways, according to an article in the February 1881 Moorhead Weekly Argonaut, but this could not be confirmed by the James J. Hill Library, in St. Paul. Mr. Skrivseth was married to Bertha Christenson on June 10, 1880 in Fargo, and they had three children named Henning, Margaret, and Jay. In 1881 he dissolved his partnership with Flaten and moved to Buxton, North Dakota. He then moved to Hillsboro, ND in 1882 where he opened a studio. While in Hillsboro he rose to prominence and served as the community's mayor. Around 1898 he opened a studio in Mayville, ND and then one in Crookston, MN. By 1905 he had moved to Minot, ND and erected the Skrivseth Block. He went to Seattle during the year of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition and worked there as a photographer. After the Exposition he returned to Minot and continued his business. In 1925 he moved to Williston with his wife and son Jay. He died on February 23, 1934 in Williston, ND.

Slaten, Albert

Business address: 303 Broadway Business years: 1916 (Hagen & Slaten)

Albert Slaten was a partner with Oscar A. Hagen in 1916. He roomed at 910 10th Avenue North. Nothing else is known of him.

Smith, Al, 1878-

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1900

Al Smith is listed in the 1900 census as a photographer. He was living as a boarder at 307 1st Avenue North with G.W. Stigleman and Ira H. Criley, who were also listed as photographers.

Smith, Henry M.

Business address: Smith Block

Business years: 1898-1899 (at A. A. Bentley & Company)

Henry M. Smith worked for A. A. Bentley & Company according to the 1898-1899 Fargo city directory.

Smith, F. F.

Business address: Unknown Business years: 1902

F. F. Smith is listed in the 1902 Polk business gazetteer as a photographer in Fargo.

Smith, Peter J., 1886-1965

Business address: 602 1/2 Front Street (1936-1948); 1948-1950--1424 4th Avenue South (1948-1950)

Business years: 1936-1950

Peter J. Smith was born on May 25, 1886 in Walhalla, North Dakota. In 1914 he moved to Mitchell, Indiana where he operated a photography studio. Here he married Dottie Woner in 1917, and they had three children named Robert, Ernest, and Wilma. In 1936 he moved to Fargo and opened a studio at 602 1/2 Front Street. In 1950 he changed occupations and became the night auditor at the Gardner Hotel. He was the president of the North Dakota Photographers Association. Mr. Smith died on January 17, 1965 at the age of 78.

Stafford, William G., 1849-1932

William G. Stafford was born on January 23, 1849 in Ohio. In the 1884-1885 business gazetteer he is found in Hastings, Minnesota as a photographer with Clarence B. Rust. He is listed as a widower in the 1920 census. He was a photographer in Fargo from 1919 to 1924, and again in 1930. He died on January 2, 1932 in Fargo.

Stene, Charles F., 1862-

Business years: 1898-1902

Charles F. Stene was born in Wisconsin in April 1862. He married a woman named Bertha around 1895 in Minnesota. He may have been involved in the clothing business as well, since the 1899-1900 city directory lists a C.F. Stene and Albert Peterson in business together as clothiers. The 1900 business gazetteer also lists C.F. Stene as operating photography studios in Hatton and Aneta, North Dakota.

Stene, Robert M.

Robert Stene was likely a brother to Charles F. Stene. The 1898-1899 city directory lists them as both living and working at 5th Street and 1st Avenue South. Robert was first listed as a partner with Hans T. Hanson in the 1896-1897 city directory. According to the 1898 business gazetteer, Robert Stene also had branch studios in Oakes and Lidgerwood, North Dakota. After 1899 Robert is no longer listed as living in North Dakota.

Stevens, A. M.

G.W. Stigleman was born in July 1862 in Indiana. He is listed in the 1900 census as a photographer. He was a boarder with Ira H. Criley and Al Smith.

Sussman, Adolph R.

Adolph R. Sussman is listed as a photographer from 1909 to 1914. His studio was called Nicollet Studio in the 1910-1911 city directory.

Swem, Thomas M., ca. 1850-

Business years: 1900-1913

Thomas M. Swem was born in Ohio in about 1850. His wife's name was Cassandra, and they were married in about 1877. They had two children named Jack and Katherine. Thomas M. Swem operated a studio in St. Paul, Minnesota for 18 years. In September 1900 he moved to Fargo and opened his studio on the second floor of 112 Broadway. In the 1910 census Thomas's son Jack was also listed as a photographer. After 1913 the Swems left Fargo.

Thorn Brothers

In Souvenir of Fargo, North Dakota, published in 1905, Thorn Brothers is listed as one of the photographers for the publication. An advertisement in the booklet states C.E. Hipple is manager of the studio located at 710 Front Street. According to the 1906-1907 Polk Business Gazetteer, Frederick A. Thorne is listed as a photographer at 710 1/2 Front Street. No other names are listed. Whether Thorne is part of the Thorn Brothers is not known.

Thune Photography

Homer S. Thune was born in Ada, Minnesota in June, 1922 to Herman S. and Alma (Olson) Thune. Homer's grandfather, Halvor W. Thune, was an early photographer in Ada, moving there in 1883 from Iowa where he was born. Homer Thune moved to Fargo where he apprenticed in the photography trade under Elwin McCracken. Homer also served in World War II. In 1948 he purchased the McCracken Studio from Robert McCracken and retained the name until about 1952 when it became Thune Photography. Frances Piersall began working at the studio doing hand coloring and retouching of negatives in 1947. They were later married and had three sons named David, John, and Dana. In 1961 they moved the studio to 657 4th Avenue North, and in 1974 it was moved to 8 North 12th Street. In 1979 the studio was moved to 1023 1st Avenue North where Mr. Thune operated the studio until his retirement in 1996. He currently lives in St. Paul, Minnesota.

Torgerson, R. G.

Business Address: 518 1st Avenue North Business Years: 1949 (Royal Tone Studio) According to the April 1949 Fargo-Moorhead Telephone Directory, R.G. Torgerson operated Royal Tone Studio at 518 1st Avenue North.

Viknes, John, ca. 1858-

John Viknes was born in about 1858 in Norway. The 1880 census has him listed as a photo artist. It also states that he was married in 1880, but no wife is listed. The 1880 business gazetteer also lists him as a photographer. In 1881 the Fargo city directory states that he had a confectionery on Front Street between 2nd and 3rd Streets. After 1881 he is no longer listed as living in Fargo.

Voss, Clifton L., 1889-1971

Business years: 1933-1953

Clifton L. Voss was born in Waterville, Minnesota on August 28, 1889. On July 28, 1918 he married Grace McClure, and together they had two children named Leslie and Eloise. Mr. Voss had been involved in studio photography prior to coming to Fargo in 1933. Voss won the earned degree of Master of Photography three times. He was a member of the Camera Craftsmen of America, the American Society of Photographers, and Photographers Society of America. He was elected president of the Photographers Association of America in 1951. In 1953 Mr. Voss retired and Archie Dewey took over his studio. Mr. and Mrs. Voss moved to California where Mrs. Voss died in 1962. Clifton returned to Fargo in about 1965, and he died on June 3, 1971 at Bethany Towers at the age of 81.

Wagner, Leslie

Leslie Wagner is listed in the 1950 city directory and phone book as a photographer at 117 North 4th Street #27. His wife's name was Irene.

Wagner, William

William Wagner was a partner with Arvid Scherling in 1924. Nothing else is known of him.

Wigness & Foseide

Business years: 1886

Mr. Wigness's name only appears in the Polk business gazetteer of 1886. He is part of the photographic firm of Wigness & Foseide. Neither Wigness nor John Foseide is found in any Fargo city directories around this time period.

Wilcox, A. J.

The only record for A. J. Wilcox as a Fargo photographer is from the 1885 Dakota Territory census. He was born circa 1866 in Michigan, while his parents were originally from New York State. At the time he was boarding with another family. He does not appear in any Fargo city directory.
