

20017 **Kellogg, Mark H. Diary, 1876.** Journalist, reporter for the *Bismarck Tribune* killed at the Battle of the Little Big Horn. The original diary or reporter note book concerning the Seventh Cavalry and the Little Big Horn Expedition consists of approximately 42 pages and measures about 4 inches by 7 ½ inches. threatening rain. Indian scouts  
brought in 7 Antelope. At noon the  
clouds broke, arose & passed  
away leaving a clear sky &  
strong west wind. Column  
moving along nicely. Ante-  
lope more plenty. Several  
were killed through the day.  
Went into camp at 5 P.M.  
Marched 13<sup>3</sup> miles, Terry  
& Custer to the front, Roads  
better, getting west of the  
water shed. 1 mule shot  
diseased with glanders, 1  
mule left behind, played  
out. Plenty water <sup>no</sup> road  
had to haul as came on.  
3 Invalids in ambulance  
one from accidental shot
