Archival Collections

10343 Prairie Public Television Records

Records consists of completed programs, series, raw footage, and supplemental materials for productions aired on Prairie Public Television.

10646 KTHI-TV (Fargo, N.D.) Broadcast News Video

Consists of mainly 3/4" videotapes and shot sheets of file tapes from 1989-1999 of the Fargo and surrounding Red River Valley.

10736 KXMB TV (Bismarck, N.D.) Collection

Consists of completed segments and raw footage produced by KXMB-TV (Bismarck, N.D.). The footage covers many social, political, and current event topics from central and western North Dakota. Also features both regional and national sports coverage.

10958 William E. "Bill" Shemorry Papers

The collection consists of office files (research, newspaper and magazine clippings, article drafts, and published articles), slides, photographs, negatives, and glass plate negatives related to Shemorry's career as a newspaper publisher, photographer, reporter, historian, researcher and author in Williston, N.D.

10983 Meyer Broadcasting Company Records

Consists of completed segments, raw footage, and full length programs produced by the various Meyer Broadcasting stations. The news film covers many social, political, and current event topics from central and western North Dakota. Also includes regional sports coverage.

11085 Fletcher Poling Oral Histories - Amateur Baseball in Northwest North Dakota and Northeast Montana
