# **Early Pioneer Life and Challenges on the Frontier**

Homesteaders faced many challenges living on the frontier. This pathfinder will lead researchers to several resources available at the North Dakota State Archives highlighting the daily life of North Dakota's homesteaders.

# **Archival Collections**

#### 10031 Sarah Boley Papers

Diaries document the weather, daily life, politics, and agricultural conditions in Morton County (N.D.).

#### **10058 Lewis Ferandus Crawford Papers**

Notebooks, essays, newspaper clippings, and correspondence concerning ranching, banking, Indians, and settlement in western North Dakota. Collection includes interviews with early settlers.

#### 10183 Elizabeth Ellen Roberts Papers

Correspondence, literary productions, printed material, and miscellaneous. Correspondence dated form 1913 to 1961, to and from Elizabeth Roberts and her husband. These letters concern ranching issues, Christmas cards, personal matters, and research information procured from the Department of Agriculture and railroad companies. The collection's literary productions are made up of autobiographical writings and reminisces, historical writings and informative papers, and research notes and drafts. These writings cover North Dakota and Dakota Territory historical topics and pioneer life. The printed material contains, dating from 1922 to 1960, brochures, Daughters of the American Revolution programs, pamphlets, and circulated poems and writings.

#### 10418 Mary Pethic Gimblett Glaspell Papers [microfilm]

Diaries, 1889-1891 and 1898-1930, describing weather conditions and family activities.

#### 11083 Alice Kennedy Dahners Papers

Alice Kennedy Dahners' (Mrs. Henry L. [H. L.] Dahners') contribution to the North Dakota Federation of Womens' Clubs Pioneer Mothers Biographies project, including handwritten, typed, and draft biographies, notes, news clippings and correspondence. Two hundred and sixty two pages in a scrapbook format and loose. Dahners lived in Mandan, ND, and many of the biographies are of pioneers in Morton County, ND.

#### 11292 Emma Ghering Gibson

Diaries, daybooks, autograph books, friend books and a self-published book about pioneer women of Haddonfield, N.J. written by Emma Ghering Gibson of Larimore (N.D.).

#### 11353 Lynn Bueling Papers

Consists of articles by Bueling that were published in the Mandan News and the Emmons County Record. The articles focus on North Dakota history and cover politics, frontier life, weather, literature, pioneers and settlers, newspapers, biographies, as well as local news, book reviews, and stories from Bueling's life.

#### 20025 Gilbert Nordhagen Manuscript

Manuscript entitled "A History of the Early Settlers of North Dakota" which describes early churches, schools, farming, and settlement in Ransom County. Includes lists and biographical sketches of Ransom County settlers and two newspaper clippings containing articles penned by Nordhagen.

#### 20035 Allen Totem Papers

Reminiscences concerning settlement in northeastern North Dakota, entitled "Pioneer Days in North Dakota."

#### 20050 Emily Lindstrom Reminiscences

Reminiscences of settlement in Grand Forks County in the 1870s.

#### 20097 Alton Giles Covell Diary

Transcript of Covell's diary describes migration and settlement in North Dakota.

#### 20104 Fred Underwood Papers

Short stories concerning pioneer life, entitled "Dan," "Civilization," "Mother," "A Memory of '83" and an untitled sketch about women in pioneer days.

#### 20239 Charles H. Hubbell Diary

Diary describes Hubbell's school, farming, and social activities, weather conditions, and trips to Tappen, Dawson, Steele, Jamestown, and Fargo.

#### 20241 James Shoemaker Papers

Papers consist of copies and transcripts of letters from Shoemaker to his family in Pike County, Pennsylvania, describing local news, settlement, weather conditions, prairie fires, and Indian wars and bounties.

#### 20306 Halvor Lars Sando Papers

Reminiscences entitled "Journeys on Foot from Grand Forks to St. Thomas, North Dakota." Manuscript describes establishment of a homestead near St. Thomas, North Dakota.

#### 20317 Mary Dunlava Tellefson Papers

The manuscript "Pioneer Days in Cass County" Biography of "Clara" describing her work as a cook on bonanza farms, including the Amenia-Sharon Land Company, and her experiences homesteading in Cass County.

#### 20354 Gustof Marcelius Papers

Copy of a letter from 12-year-old Marcelius to his mother describing his experiences in the Dakota Territory.

#### 20357 Lars Johnson Papers

Correspondence of the Johnson family describing farming activities, local news, weather conditions, and family matters.

#### 20449 Anna Rudser Serumgard Papers

Typescript entitled "Pioneer Homes in the Lake Region." Manuscript describes dugouts, cabins, claim shacks, and various aspects of homesteading in the Devils Lake area.

#### 20544 A. S. Pratt Papers

Photocopy of a letter by Pratt to Theodore Horton, Steuben County, New York, concerning severe winter weather and homesteading near Page, North Dakota.

#### 20676 Willard E. Arnold Papers

Carbon copy typescript of reminiscences of homesteading, farming, personalities, dances, winter hazards, and encounters with Indians near Portland (N.D.),1860s-1870s.

#### 20693 Edna Dey Warner Papers

Typescript reminiscences of homesteading near Mandan, North Dakota, ca. 1904-1910.

#### 20796 Jacob Huber Papers

The 105 page manuscript includes stories about residents living in central North Dakota.

#### 21337 Gladys Pearce Papers

"Claimed by the Prairies" (manuscript) is a typed copy and covers the life of Winnie Nicholls from 1830 to 1914, dealing particularly with her life after 1873 as a Bismarck Pioneer. Among people mentioned are Alexander McKenzie, Dennis Hannifin, Calamity Jane, General Custer, Comanche, and the Marquis de Mores. Described are travel by covered wagon, Fort Seward (Jamestown), gambling halls, the removal of the capital to Bismarck, the 1898 fire, Negro settlements, statehood, Camp Hancock, early schools, social life of Bismarck, scenes in early Montana and many other subjects.
