Photography

In the late 1800s, important changes were made to cameras. One of these changes was the switch from plates to film roll, facilitated by an invention from Dakota Territory resident, David Henderson Houston. This pathfinder will lead researchers to several resources available at the North Dakota State Archives highlighting the important role photography has played in North Dakota history.

Archival Collections

10105 Frank Bennett Fiske Papers

Fiske family correspondence, minutes of the Catholic Order of Foresters (Fort Yates, ND), Fiske's research files, manuscripts, articles, diaries and journals, studio registers, cash books, guest register, programs, notes, notebooks, broadsides, audio recordings and a play script by Angela Fiske.

10200 Nancy Hendrickson Papers

Diaries discuss gardening, housework, farming, family affairs, photography work, a broadside advertising the estate auction at the Christenson farm (Morton County, N.D.) and photographic images of animals, community events, people, home life and agricultural scenes. Photograph formats include an album of photographic prints, loose prints, glass plate negatives, and film negatives.

10547Kathie (Ryckman) Anderson Papers, Folders (Box 7, Folder 4, Box 7, Folder 13)

Papers consist of a draft manuscript copy entitled "Dakota: The Literary Heritage of the Northern Prairie State" from which excerpts were published in North Dakota History, as well as research, notes and publications about North Dakota authors and musicians, and cassette tapes of interviews with North Dakota authors.

10553 Frank E. Vyzralek Collection, (Box 3, Folder 3—Box 5, Folder 14)

The collection includes the research files, personal papers, photographs and audiovisual materials of lifelong researcher and former North Dakota State Archivist Frank Edward Vyzralek. Notable areas of research include North Dakota photographers, baseball, beer and bottling, mills and elevators, crime, the North Dakota Teachers Insurance and Retirement Fund, North Dakota "Centennial Moments," biographies, place names, Bismarck (N.D.), railroads and steamboats.

The collection consists of office files (research, newspaper and magazine clippings, article drafts, and published articles), slides, photographs, negatives, and glass plate negatives related to Shemorry's career as a newspaper publisher, photographer, reporter, historian, researcher and author in Williston, N.D.

Papers of the Zimmerman and Burr families, including legal documents, diaries, poetry, reminiscences, newspaper clippings, notes, genealogy, information about farm sales to the U.S. Government for the construction of the Garrison Dam.
