# **Radio and Television in North Dakota**

This pathfinder will lead researchers to several resources available at the North Dakota State Archives highlighting the introduction of radio, televisions, and television stations in North Dakota.

## **Archival Collections**

#### 10351 WDAY-TV Records

Collection consists of television news broadcast scripts, broadcast schedules, correspondence and approximately 1.5 million feet of WDAY-TV and WDAZ-TV news film, 1953-1978.

#### 10711 John W. and Constance (Blackstead) Boler Papers

Consists of scrapbooks containing correspondence, permits, by-laws, incorporation certificates, affiliation agreements, board minutes, federal and state legislative material, reports, speeches, press releases, scripts, pamphlets, brochures, marketing publications, photographs, memorabilia, publications relating to broadcasting outlets owned by Mr. Boler, and his other business and political activities. North Dakota radio and television stations include KCJB radio, Minot (N.D.); KFGO radio, Fargo (N.D.); KSJB radio, Jamestown (N.D.); KXGO-TV, Fargo (N.D.); KXJB-TV, Fargo (N.D.); KXMB-TV, Bismarck (N.D.); and KXMC-TV, Minot (N.D.).

#### 10684 Roy H. "Andy" Andersen Collection

Collections includes audiotapes, film, and corresponding papers created by Roy H. "Andy" Andersen. The audiotapes consist of radio interviews by Andersen with Governor William Guy, President Lyndon B. Johnson, US Senator Edward (Ted) Kennedy, and businessman Robert McCarney. There is an oral history with Andy Andersen about his life and the changes in the radio broadcasting business.

#### 11246 KMHA Radio (New Town, N.D.) Collection

Reel-to-reel audio recordings of interviews, live broadcasts, presentations, celebrations, and events recorded and/or used by Fort Berthold Communications Enterprises radio station KMHA.

#### 11409 WDAY Radio (Fargo, N.D.) Collection

Recording of the ceremonies for the presentation of the bust of the late L. L. Twitchell to the state of North Dakota (2 parts on 2 78 rpm discs).

#### 10553 Frank E. Vyzralek Collection

The collection includes the research files, personal papers, photographs and audiovisual materials of lifelong researcher and former North Dakota State Archivist Frank Edward Vyzralek. The research files include original work and information compiled about agriculture, arts and entertainment, business and industry, city and town life, education, ethnicity, Indians of North America, history, military, people, places, politics and government, religion and transportation. These broad areas of research are organized further by topic. Notable areas of research include North Dakota photographers, baseball, beer and bottling, mills and elevators, crime, the North Dakota Teachers Insurance and Retirement Fund, North Dakota "Centennial Moments," biographies, place names, Bismarck (N.D.), railroads and steamboats.

# 11444 Inauguration of United Press News Service for North Dakota State Capitol Records

First story ever dispatched over a teletype from the North Dakota State Capitol to a radio station. Collection includes the record, the tape used in the transmission, and a teletype copy.

#### 11509 KFYR Radio and Television Advertising Collection

Consists of 26 33rpm lp records of advertisements for the First National Bank of Mandan, Dakota National Bank, Gate City Savings, jingles for meat and ice cream, Romper Room, Corwin Churchill wrestling, Red Owl, Mehus Conservatory, tires, skip rope jingle, Mandan United Fund, Super Value jingle, McLaughlin Livestock, and Midway Furniture.

#### 20506 KBOM Radio Records (Bismarck, North Dakota)

Records consist of advertisement and news scripts, program logs, and workmen's compensation certificates.

#### 30431 Radio Broadcasting System. Subject Files.

Series consists of correspondence, memoranda, staff meeting minutes, monthly activity reports, and subject files concerning administration of the agency, emergency broadcasting, regulation, and conferences.

#### 32182 Radio Communications, State. Records

Series consists of the early records of State Radio (includes station logs, annual and biennial reports and permits) 1950-1980s, 911 Advisory Committee Meeting Records 1987-1996, and County Operational Plans for the 911 system 1985-1999.

#### 30648 Educational Broadcasting Council. Subject Files.

Educational Broadcasting Council. Subject Files, 1962-1979. Series consists of correspondence, reports, memoranda, state plans, contracts, notes, budgets, promotional materials and records of the North Dakota Educational Television Commission (minutes, correspondence, memoranda, proposals, and surveys). Series relates to administration of the Council, legislation affecting public broadcasting, research, and the North Dakota Educational Television Association, Inc.
